



- and do not stare at the IR LED. Also, since the IR LED and the area around it may become hot while the IR LED is flashing, do not touch the IR LED or the area around it. You cannot add memory to your VAIO computer.
- While your VAIO computer is turned on, pressing the battery off button may cause loss of unsaved data. Before pressing the battery off button, be sure to save all unsaved data and turn off the computer.

• The IR LED flashes while face recognition is in use. Keep your face away from

- Your VAIO computer contains a non-removable battery pack.
- Your VAIO computer has a built-in magnet at either side of the touch pad. Keep anything that is sensitive to the magnetic field, such as a credit card, away from the portion below the keyboard to avoid corrupting the stored data.
- While the & Mic Mute indicator is unlit, the microphone may be disabled by the app in use.
- Depending on the shape of your security lock, it may come in contact with the LCD screen lid when you lift open the lid excessively. Be aware that this may cause superficial damage, such as a scratch.
- Your VAIO computer is capable of displaying output simultaneously on up to four devices, including the computer's LCD screen.



1 Connect to a Power Outlet

Plug the AC adapter to the USB Type-C[™] port on the VAIO computer and connect the AC adapter and a power outlet with the supplied power

You can plug the AC adapter to the USB Type-C™ port located on either the left or right side of the computer.



To connect a mobile battery or adapter that does not support USB Power Delivery to the USB Type-C[™] port, use the following procedure to do the settings on your VAIO computer according to the ratings of the device you are connecting.


- (1) Select (start), and then select VAIO Control Center from the menu.
- (2) Select Hardware, and then in USB Type-C Power Delivery, select 1.0A (Output current less than 1.5A) or 1.5A (Output current 1.5A or higher).

2 Turn On Your VAIO Computer

Lift the LCD screen lid and press the () power button on the computer.



- When lifting the LCD screen lid, do not grasp the area around the camera as it will cause malfunctions.
- Do not turn off your VAIO computer before the Windows Setup window appears.

3 Set Up Windows (Initial Setup)

By activating the Human Presence Sensor functions through VAIO Control Center along with setting up Windows Hello, you can make the following available:

- Locking and placing the system into Sleep mode when you leave your VAIO computer
- Bringing the system back from Sleep mode and immediately starting face recognition when you come back to your VAIO computer
- Keeping the sleep timer and the screen saver disabled while you are at your VAIO computer without working on it for a while

To activate the sensor functions, follow these

- 1 Select (start) and select VAIO Control Center from the menu.
- **2** Select **Sensor** and select **On** for every function concerning the Human Presence Sensor. The Human Presence Sensor detects whether "a person" is present right in front of the sensor The detection range of the sensor may vary depending on your environment. 4. Using the Fingerprint sensor, the Human Presence Sensor, and the Face Recognition Compatible Camera

- The fingerprint and face recognition rates vary depending on your use of the fingerprint sensor and the face recognition compatible camera. They are not consistent among individuals as
- Keep the fingerprint sensor, the Human Presence Sensor, and the face recognition compatible camera unscratched and clean to prevent failures or malfunctions. When the sensor or the camera is soiled, wipe it clean with the supplied cleaning cloth.
- Please be aware that your enrolled data for fingerprint authentication and face recognition may be erased in the course of repair work to your VAIO computer.
- When you enroll fingerprints, be sure to enroll more than one finger, in case of injuries.
- Depending on the state of your fingerprint or your use of the fingerprint sensor, enrollment or authentication of the fingerprint may fail. When fingerprint authentication fails, try the following:
- Use another finger.
- Clean the finger.
- Delete the fingerprint already enrolled, and then enroll it once again.
- During a dry season, such as winter, be sure to touch a metal object to discharge static electricity from your body before scanning your fingerprint. Static electricity may cause malfunctions of the fingerprint sensor.

• If you have enabled fingerprint authentication for recovery from Sleep mode, your VAIO computer

- may recover from Sleep mode unintentionally if something touches the fingerprint sensor, such as while you are carrying it in a bag. • Be sure to open the camera privacy shutter
- before using face recognition. While the camera privacy shutter is closed, the camera lens is blocked by the shutter and face recognition fails.
- For successful face recognition, you need to remove sunglasses or a face mask, if any, from the face and present your face as it was enrolled.
- Face enrollment/recognition may fail under certain circumstances. In such a case, one of the following may help.
- Delete your enrolled data for face recognition and enroll your face once again. - If you are in bright sunlight, shade the sunlight
- or move away from it and scan your face for recognition.
